◀ A moving **LIVING WAY OF THE CROSS** followed, inspiring us to reflect on Christ's passion and sacrifice.

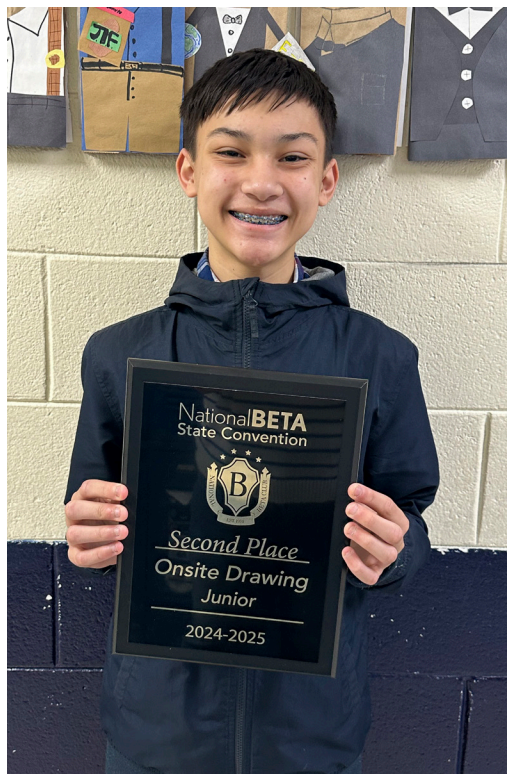
ATHLETICS & CLUBS

MARDI GRAS EXPO

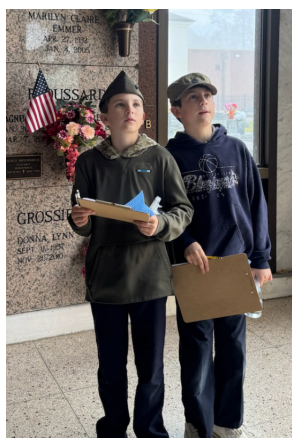


GOD BLESS THE USA:

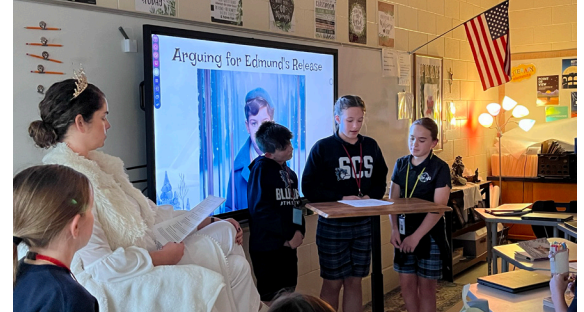

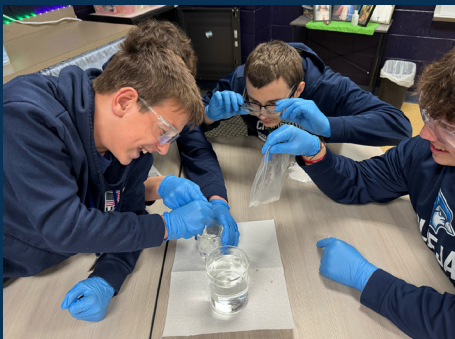
